AGM Business (in line with the Constitution)

The AGM will include:

3. Any other business as determined by the Divisional Council

Divisional Council Elections 2026

Under the Constitution, the Divisional Council consists of a President, up to three Vice Presidents, and up to ten Elected Members.

Nominations and Eligibility

Nominations must be submitted in advance and must be:

- From a current Cannock Chase Chamber member
- Nominated and seconded by members of the Chamber
- Submitted in the manner and by the deadline set out in the AGM joining instructions

Nominees may supply an individual profile of up to 200 words, which will be made available to members ahead of the election where received.

Voting

Where the number of candidates exceeds the number of vacancies, a ballot will be held in accordance with the Constitution. If nominations do not exceed vacancies, the Chair may confirm appointments by a simple vote at the AGM.

Co-opted Members

In addition to elected positions, the Divisional Council may co-opt members in line with the Constitution. Any co-options are confirmed by the Divisional Council (not elected at the AGM) and will be handled separately through Council process.
